No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

VALIDITY OF ENTRY FORM
Telephone, telegraph and fax entries cannot be accepted. Entries not on an official AKC Entry Form or Entry Forms without the Agreement and Rules on the reverse side of the form are not acceptable. Unsigned Entry Forms cannot be accepted nor entries which specify any conditions as to its acceptance. Entry forms MUST be filled out completely. Incomplete entries do not constitute a valid entry.
Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, whoever may make such errors, & no entry will be refunded in event of such errors or cancellation of entries after published closing date. PLEASE PRINT OR TYPE CLEARLY. NO STAPLES OR TAPE PLEASE.
The instructions for submitting an application state that including the sire, dam and breeder are required if known. AKC is taking the position that information is known in the case of dogs with AKC registration numbers, and thus is required for the entry to be valid.

The exhibitor is fully responsible for entering the dog in the correct class(es)/height divisions. Dogs running in a lower height division than they are eligible for will be eliminated		

ENTRY FEES
-First entry of each dog \$25 (\$12.50 Jr Handler) Friday / \$18 (\$9 Jr Handler) Saturday/Sunday -Additional entry of each dog \$15 (\$7.50 Jr Handler) Friday / \$18 (\$9 JR Handler) Saturday/Sunday Includes an AKC recording fee of \$3.50 for the first entry and \$3.50 for each additional entry of the same dog. Please make checks payable to Pals and Paws Inc. There will be a \$40 fee for returned checks. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. Incomplete, illegible and unsigned entries will not be accepted and will be returned to the exhibitor. Online Entries will be accepted through the AKC Online System. During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries will be designated as follows: Online entries – 100 / Paper entries – 250. If either form of entry has not filled at the end of the 48 hour time period, the club reserves the right to decrease or increase the online or paper limits accordingly.

MAXIMUM ENTRIES PER ENVELOPE
A maximum of 10 entries per envelope is allowed. Envelopes with more than 10 entries and/or entries received prior to opening date will be returned.

FIRST RECEIVED/HAND DELIVERY
Paper entries received within 24 hours of the opening date and time must include postage or be metered and must be delivered by a multi-state or multi-national postal or carrier service including but not limited to USPS, FedEx, UPS and DHL. If these conditions are not met, the entries are not valid and must be returned to the sender.

REFUNDS
Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused or barred from competition by action of the Trial Committee. Pals and Paws Inc. has no obligation to refund duplicate entries. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed for any reason beyond the control of the organizing committee. Bitches in season are not permitted in the Trial. For bitches that come into season after the closing date, a refund will be made, less \$5.00. Written notification to claim this refund must be received by the Secretary no later than 30 minutes before the start of the trial.

MEASURING AND HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION

Effective January 1, 2010, exhibitors are no longer required to provide proof to Trial Secretaries that their dog has a valid jump height card as part of the check-in process. Furthermore, this change eliminates the need for a copy of the jump height card to be submitted with an entry form. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured/wicketed by the **Judge of Record** PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. The exception to this requirement is a dog entered in the 24" height division. However if a **Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO)** or an **Agility Field Rep** is present; **ALL** dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog wicketed by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog **before** its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.

NEW Simplified Jump Height Card Process

When filling out the entry form, there is a new section at the top of the form for exhibitors to designate whether your dog has a valid jump height card or if your dog needs to be measured. Please check the appropriate box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the Dogs To Be Measured List. It is no longer required that you submit a copy of your dog's jump height card with your entry form or show it during the day of show check-in.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs **over the age of fifteen (15) months** that are registered with the American Kennel Club, or that have obtained AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or Approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) Breeds.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/IPL) or and AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word 'dog' is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs should be physically sound. Bitches in season, aggressive dogs, blind dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance shall not be eligible. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Dogs under four (4) months of age are prohibited at AKC Agility Trials.

PRIZES & AWARDS

Rosettes or flat placement ribbons will be awarded to 1st – 4th places in each jump height in each class. Qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all dogs receiving a qualifying score. Dogs must qualify to receive placement ribbons. Any dog that finishes a title will receive a special rosette.

MIXED HEIGHTS & CLASSES

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

FEO & FIX N GO

Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO) – effective July 1, 2024

FEO allows exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is now allowed in all classes. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying. All classes (STD, JWW & T2B) except FAST are limited to 45 seconds, not the SCT.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master). If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).
- Toys are allowed in the ring
 - Toys must be non-audible
 - Toys may not leave the handler's hand
 - Toys that roll freely cannot be used
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring
- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and/or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time

Fix and Go On (FNG)

FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score. Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

INTERNATIONAL SWEEPSTAKES CLASS (ISC)

Purpose: The International Sweepstakes Class (ISC) is a non-regular class providing the dog and handler an opportunity to demonstrate their advanced training and handling skills on various International Style Standard and Jumpers with Weaves courses. The rules for this class are generally based on international rules. The variety in International Agility course designs is very diverse, so handlers should be prepared to meet the "Challenge of the Day" when competing in the ISC class. The total challenge level may be easier, more difficult, or simply different from what is currently allowed in Excellent / Master Class. Complete rules for the ISC are available from the AKC Website (<https://www.akc.org>).

Eligibility: ISC classes are open to dogs that are eligible to compete in AKC agility trials. There is no Preferred Option for ISC; dogs may enter at their preferred jump height, however they will be scored against dogs entered in the corresponding Regular jump height. Eligible dogs may be entered in any level of ISC (1, 2, or 3) and in multiple levels at the trial. At present, there are no eligibility requirements for any level of ISC and any dog that is eligible according to the above information may run any level. Day of show level changes are not allowed.

Jump Heights: DOGS MAY BE ENTERED IN THEIR REGULAR JUMP HEIGHTS. However, only those dogs running in the 12", 16", 20" and 24" class that meet the FCI/ISC measuring cutoff (different than regular AKC cutoffs) may use their clean run toward the qualifications required toward entering WTT or EOTT.

Please see the EO/AWC Tryout Rules for further details.

COMMON ISC QUESTIONS

Who can enter ISC?

- Anyone who wants to try it. There are no restrictions on what levels you can enter in ISC and how many classes you enter on a single day. If you want to enter all ISC runs on Thursday, you may.

Does my dog have to jump at their ISC jump height?

- No. You can enter your dog in regular or preferred at the height they normally jump in AKC. However, runs at AKC jump heights will not count toward EOTT qualifications.

How do ISC courses compare with other AKC courses?

- ISC courses generally have more space between obstacles than other AKC courses. Most ISC courses designed by FCI judges have a really nice flow for the dogs but can be challenging for the handlers. In general, ISC level 1 courses have about the same level of difficulty as AKC Open courses. ISC level 2 courses have about the same difficulty as AKC Ex/Master courses but may include some Premier elements. In general, ISC level 3 courses are more difficult than courses offered in regular AKC trials.

How is ISC judged?

- ISC is judged using FCI rules. A summary of the scoring system is included in Chapter 14 of the "AKC Regulations for Agility Trials, Non-Regular Agility Classes International Sweepstakes Class".

How are the runs scored?

- Faults, then time.

What are Faults in ISC?

- Course Time Penalties are one (1) fault for each full second over Standard Course Time
- Standard (S) faults incur a five (5) point penalty and include:
 - A displaced bar or displaceable surface that the dog was to jump over
 - Missed down contact zones on all contacts and missed up contact zone on the teeter
 - Seesaw fly-off or Missed weave pole once entered correctly (assessed only once per set of weave poles)
 - Knocking down one of the boards of the Broad Jump. No other contacts faulted.
 - Breaking apart the Tire Jump
- Refusal (R) faults incur a five (5) point penalty and include:
 - Refusal at any obstacle
 - Run out at any obstacle
 - Dog exiting a contact obstacle prior to starting its descent on that obstacle
 - Failure to enter the Weave Poles properly
- Elimination Faults
 - Three (3) refusals and/or run-outs on a course
 - Dog running the wrong course, including touching the wrong obstacle with one (1) paw.
 - Dog/handler contact or Handler/equipment contact if it aids or was intended to aid the performance of the dog
 - Outside assistance to the handler/dog in the ring that aided the performance
 - Failure to complete all the obstacles on the course.
 - Completing an obstacle is defined as:
 - Jumping over jumps and through tires in the proper direction
 - Starting descent on a contact obstacle
 - Going through the tunnels in the proper direction
 - Weaving all weave poles after proper entry

Pals & Paws is hosting our first ever ISC Cup! Awards will be given to the combined winner of each level at each jump height. Teams must run in both the jumpers and standard runs for each level (A1/J1, A2/J2, A3/J3) to qualify.

Scoring:

Scores from standard and jumpers will be combined to determine the overall winner of each height. Preferred jump heights will be scored with the regular jump height (16" preferred with 20" regular). As well as ISC heights will be judged with the corresponding jump height (20" ISC Intermediate with 20" regular). ISC scoring is based on faults then time. The dog with the fewest faults wins. If more than one dog has the same amount of faults, lowest course time wins.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

Pals and Paws Agility, the trial secretary, their agents, etc., assume no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by exhibitors or their dogs or property, and further assume no responsibility for injury to children not under the control of their parents or guardians.

Owners or handlers entering dogs in a trial do so at their own risk and agree to assume responsibility for any damage caused by them, or by their dogs. They also agree to abide by the Rules of The American Kennel Club and the current edition of the AKC Agility Regulations.

The safety of the dogs is of primary importance. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all of the obstacles safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dog and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior, may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the show site. There will be no refund of entry fees if a person is asked to leave the trial site.

Dogs must be kept on leash except when in the ring or the designated warm-up area.

Pinch/prong collars, and electric collars (dummy or not) are prohibited on the trial grounds.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases and have appropriate vaccinations.

Single copies of the latest edition of "Rules for Agility Trials" and "Rules Applying to Registration and Dog Shows" may be obtained from the American Kennel Club.

MOVE UPS

For Saturday, dogs may be moved up to a higher class at the written request of the owner, as a result of qualifying for an agility title, provided that the request is made to the Trial Secretary in writing (e-mail is accepted) no later than 5:00 PM on the Monday before the trial. Requests made after that time will NOT be accommodated.

E-mail move-ups will not be official unless acknowledged by the Trial Secretary. Dogs so moved up will be entered at the end of the running order. For Sunday, requests for move ups must be made in writing to the Trial Secretary prior to the close of the previous days' events.

AFTER CLOSING WAIT LIST

A wait list will be maintained for these trials once they have closed on September 6, 2024. The wait list will be active until Saturday September 14, 2024 6:00 PM. Any runs that are entered in these trials at closing and pulled before the wait list deadline will be replaced, if possible, by runs in order on the wait list, and the exhibitor will be reimbursed for the number of runs replaced. If a run is pulled, but cannot be replaced, the exhibitor will not receive a refund and the dog will be considered absent from the run. Entry fees for runs on the wait list that do not get into the trial by the wait list closing date, will be refunded in full.

COURSE FAMILIARIZATION AND WARM UP

A walk-through period will be held prior to each class, following the judge's briefing. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class. A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, shall be provided for all exhibitors

OBSTACLES

All obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current Regulations of Agility Trials.

VENDOR INFORMATION

Vendors are welcome at our trial. The vendor fee is \$25 (\$75 for electricity) for the weekend. Vendor fees must be paid on the first day of the trial. For further information, please contact the trial chairperson.

VOLUNTEER WORKERS FOR TRIAL

We really appreciate our volunteer helpers! A sign-up board will be set up each morning for volunteers.

Discount coupons for future trial entries will be provided to all volunteers. We will have a Worker Raffle at the end of each day. Prizes include \$25 coupons towards future trials.

RV RESERVATIONS

DIRECTIONS TO TRIAL SITE

Coming Into Florida From The North:

Take 95 SOUTH to 295 SOUTH, 13 miles to Exit 21b Interstate 110 WEST towards Lake City, 6 miles to Exit 350 (SR 23 South) toward Cecil Commerce Center Parkway. Go 2.4 miles to Exit 44 (POW-MIA Memorial Pkwy) turn right towards FSCJ Cecil Center, Cecil Airport. 2.2 miles turn right onto Normandy Blvd. Entrance is 1.2 miles on the right.

Coming North From South Florida:

Take 95 NORTH, 77.2 miles to 295 NORTH, 15.6 miles to the 103rd. Street (State Road 134) Exit 16. Turn left off the ramp, go 7.8 miles and turn right on New World Ave. Go one block and turn left on Normandy Blvd. (State Road 228).

Coming From The Ocala Area:

Take US 27 NORTH, 0.5 miles to US 301. Keep straight onto US 301, 22.5 miles. Turn right onto US 301 NORTH, 51.3 miles, turn right onto Normandy Blvd. (State Road 228).

TRIAL SITE INFORMATION

The trial site is an indoor covered arena with packed dirt ring surfaces. Each ring is 110' x 110'. There is ample space in the arena to set up crates. There is also space available outside the arena if you chose to set up a tent. Electronic timers will be used at this trial.

If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the AKC Canine Partners Program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.
